	<ul> <li>Some general observations:</li> <li>Children don't recognize hazards as well as those who work on site.</li> <li>Locked equipment may still be a hazard.</li> <li>All excavations are potential forts or swimming pools.</li> <li>Scaffolds become gym sets.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Discouraging children:</li> <li>Don't allow children on site during the day.</li> <li>Erect a site fence.</li> <li>Mark excavations with signs or guard or both. (Remember: Fall protection rules.)</li> <li>Group and lock up equipment at night.</li> <li>Post "No Trespassing" signs.</li> <li>Ask for regular police patrols to check out your jobsite. If necessary, post a guard.</li> </ul>
